WHAT IS NYLT?

The National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT) is a 6-day long program where scouts learn leadership, communication, planning, problemsolving, teamwork, and also participate in fun outdoor challenges.

WHY NYLT?

The NYLT course centers around the concepts of what a leader must BE, what they must KNOW, and what they must DO. The key elements are then taught with a clear focus on HOW TO. The skills come alive during the week as the patrol goes on a Quest for the Meaning of Leadership.

Participants camp, work, play and learn, living a month in the life of a model troop/ team/crew condensed into an intense week long conference. They experience the stages of team development, practice from a "toolbox" of leadership skills and learn that leadership requires vision, goals, and planning. Participants learn how to be a leading influence in their own unit; discovering resources, methods, games and new skills to make unit meetings, treks and other activities more exciting and worthwhile. They also develop skills that help them emerge as leaders outside their units; at school and in the community.

NYLT GOALS

- To develop a youth's confidence and knowledge in leading their unit's program.
- To gain working understanding of the resources, skills and methods needed to undertake further leadership responsibility
- To support adult leaders in training youth leaders.
- To reinforce a youth's relationship with thier unit leader and other adult leaders.
- To experience Scouting at its very best.
